Home Reading Program

All children K-6 now have their home reading folder and are able to exchanged their books every day and take a new book home each afternoon. Regular and consistent reading practice achieves significant reading improvement. It is a school expectation the EVERY child will take home a book to read. I urge parents to provide encouragement and the structure for children to read to someone every night. This should be recorded in the folder provided, each day. The school will closely monitor this program and inform parents if children are not borrowing regularly.

School Swimming Carnival

On Monday 13th February, 25 students from grades 3-6 attended the school swimming carnival at Fairfield Leisure Centre. It was the most competitors that the school has had in many years.
